2. Submissions

Submitted manuscript which should not exceed 7000 words should be typeset in MS word Times New Roman Font 12, with double line spacing. The first page should include the title of the manuscript, name(s) and institution affiliation/address, abstract (not more than 250 words and with not more than six keywords). Manuscript should conform to the current APA or MLA style sheet. Author(s) of published papers will derive the benefits of peer-review of contributions by seasoned scholars, global visibility and receipt of hard copies as well as soft copies of their papers.
